We hereby notify you that the person described in the margin, being at that time employed by us, in our works at Foundry 30 Bloomingdale Rd. in the capacity of Moulder was injured on Friday Nov. 16, 1900, at 4:45 o'clock, P. M.

Name, Martin J. Duggan Age, 28 Married or Single? Single Weekly Wages, \$16.50 Nationality, Irish Speaks and understands English? Yes How long in your service? Ten months How long employed at work he was doing when hurt? Ten months Was this regular duty of employee? Yes

Cause and manner of the injury were as follows, Duggan was pouring off his moulds and at the time the accident occurred was standing near the cupola waiting for iron. There was about two pounds of dull iron in his ladle, left from a mould he had just finished pouring. He was resting the ladle on the ground when someone stepped backward and accidentally upset it. The iron was inside of his left shoe burning his foot near the toes.

Nature and extent of injury, give physician's report, if any, The burn did not keep Duggan from work until five and one half days after the accident occurred.

Was the injury due to any negligence or fault, and (if so) whose and what? No.
