Dear Orrin:

I am enclosing a copy of a letter and a resume from Mr. Duane Pearsall, who is president of the Small Business Development Corporation in Denver, Colorado. Duane has been a very successful small businessman and recently sold his business in Colorado. The proceeds from the sale have enabled Duane to spend considerable time and energy in the promotion of and development of small business organizations in Colorado and the intermountain west. I know him as president of the Mountain States Association, which is an organization of 8 states in the intermountain west dedicated to the improvement of small business.

Duane has become very interested in the position of Administrator of the Small Business Administration. As the letter notes, he has been recommended by both the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the Council of Small and Independent Business Associations for this position.

As he also notes, he does not need the job. He wants to serve and believes that he has a contribution to make to national government. I agree with him in this and believe Duane would make an excellent contribution, particularly since he is not a career bureaucrat nor one who needs an income.
